international financial reform can move beyond questions of architecture and towards how it may be possible to build consensus.

The Warwick Commission is concerned with the political economy of reform, focusing explicitly on the politics of the Global Financial Crisis and its links to the real economy in OECD economies, as well as questions of representation for Emerging Market Economies within international financial reform.

The Commission report was launched in New Delhi in November 2009 to widespread coverage in the international media. The event in Beijing provides the opportunity to focus on how the Commission's findings relate to one of the world's largest economies – China.
